CJE provided designs and installations of the

electrical, lighting and sound systems for Sacred Heart Church in McCartyville. Our company also installed the electrical system and service for the McCartyville waste water sewer project along with an automatic backup generator system.

We were pleased to be the electrical contractor that transformed a portion of the former Monarch Machine Tool building into a state of the art facility now used by Ring Corp., a manufacturer of plastic

mold injection products in Sidney.

Simultaneously, while undertaking the Ring project we also designed and installed electrical systems for the new Safeway Packaging facility in New Bremen. This structure is approximately six acres under one roof. Upon completion of both these facilities we moved and re-installed their manufacturing equipment.

With involvement in these two large projects we still focused on maintaining

service to our core customers. CJE maintains business form Toledo to Cincinnati and Columbus to Indianapolis.

C & J Electric was involved with many EPACT projects during the past year. EPACT, the Energy Policy Act of 2005 passed by congress, gives tax incentives to qualifying, new and existing manufacturing and warehousing facilities that utilizes energy efficient lighting.

Measurements and cal-

culations of current lighting systems are done and calculations are provided for proposed lighting fixtures. In most scenarios, with the replacement of current light fixtures there is an instant energy savings recognized and if IRS criteria is met a tax incentive given, which can be several thousands of dollars. Not only does this program save money, it also helps in saving the environment. We look forward to an ever growing customer base and very successful 2008.
