a series of residential air conditioning components that communicate back and forth to protect the system, increase energy efficiency and ensure comfort for the homeowner.

The company's refrigeration business continued reaching out to new markets. Global transport refrigeration (using the Copeland Scroll compressor) saw positive growth and promises to be a significant growth market in the future. The business also saw new application growth in existing markets, most notably the growth of distributed refrigeration systems in supermarkets, where refrigerated cases are placed throughout the supermarket as opposed to centralized in one area. These applications also use Copeland Scroll compressors, because of their compact size and other attributes such as inherent energy efficiency.

Emerson Climate Technologies continued its commitment to North American Technician Excellence (NATE) certification testing. In 2007, the company worked with NATE to begin a new certification program for

refrigeration, allowing those technicians to gain this important accreditation. This new certification will likely be ready to announce in 2008.

The company continues to place a high value and priority on community support and involvement. In 2007, Emerson Climate Technologies was the leading supporter to the Shelby County United Way, accounting for about 25 percent of the organization's budget. In November, Emerson donated \$1 million to the University of Dayton's Project Innovation Laboratory. This gift provides opportunities for engineering and business students to work on new product development, potentially spurring the creation of new businesses.

Emerson Climate Technologies looks forward to another successful and innovative year in 2008, as the company continues to expand its global business and strengthen customer relations. The company will continue to manufacture the heating, ventilation, air conditioning and refrigeration industry's best products while providing world-class support to its customers.
