Consulting services were provided for the Shelby County Commissioners.

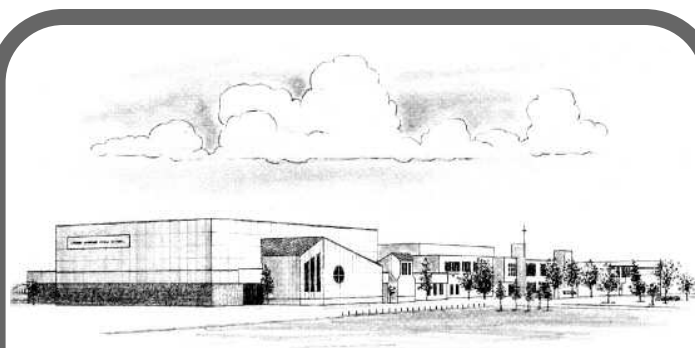
